### EASTER 2008 Trip to Fort Lauderdale Peacock Bass Fishing

[Peacock Bass](#) were introduced into the Canal Systems around Miami in 1984 by the Florida Wildlife Commission to control the spread of illegally introduced invasive species. Peacock Bass (Originally from Brazil) are a territorial and voracious predator. They are limited to a few areas in South Florida where the water temperatures are high enough to sustain them. The hotter the better for Peacocks. They come out in the morning and sun themselves on the shallow ledges of the canals where they can warm up. This gives the sight fisherman the opportunity to target individual fish and to place the Fly in their territory. This can invoke a savage strike, or just a warning brush of the fly. Never mind if you do not get a hook up first time, the Peacocks are more than willing to chase that Fly again and again. Peacocks in the Canals like dead ends, as these get less traffic and the water warms up quicker.
